Terms and conditions for the Clayton Utz Women in Construction Scholarship Fund 2025

1. Structure

- The value of each scholarship is \$3,330.00 which is available in each region and will directly contribute to costs associated with accessing and participating in training at TasTAFE. This may include tuition and upfront course fees, transport costs, textbooks, internet access, respite for carer responsibilities along with anything else that will have a demonstrated impact on the ability to undertake and engage with study at TasTAFE.
- It is available to eligible students who enrolled in a qualification relating to the construction industry at TasTAFE in Semester 1, 2025.
- The scholarship will be paid in full by TasTAFE (on behalf of Clayton Utz) upon nomination of eligible and suitable applicants selected by a panel comprising TasTAFE and Clayton Utz
- Scholarships are awarded to applicants who, at the discretion of the selection panel, have fully met the scholarship criteria.
- Eligible applicants, and recipients, will be permitted to apply in future years.

2. Eligibility

Applicants must meet the following eligibility criteria:

- Applicants must be Australian citizens or have permanent Australian resident status.
- Applicants must be a female student enrolled in a TasTAFE qualification relating to the construction industry in Semester 1, 2025.
- Applicants must be committed to complete the nominated qualification at TasTAFE in an appropriate timeframe.
- Eligible qualifications are highlighted in Appendix A.
- Applicants must complete and submit the application form provided by TasTAFE.

- Applicants must attest that they are not in receipt of any other scholarship valued more than \$500 in total at the time of application.
- Applicants must provide evidence of:
 - (i) commitment to study; and
 - (ii) commitment to using the scholarship to directly assist with accessing and participating in training at TasTAFE.

3. Administration

- Shortlisting of eligible recipients will be conducted by a selection panel from TasTAFE, with the option for Clayton Utz to participate in the process.
- The selection panel will assess shortlisted applicants and determine the recipients. The final list of recipients will then be forwarded to Clayton Utz for their information.
- TasTAFE, in collaboration with Clayton Utz, will notify all applicants in writing of the outcome of their application.
- All information supplied to panel members, along with relevant TasTAFE and Clayton Utz staff, will be treated as confidential.
